## Hope Academy Annual Education Report

August 17, 2014

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2013-2014 educational progress for Hope Academy. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

Our school has been identified as a Priority School.

The key challenges for Hope Academy are ensuring our students' proficiency in Science and Mathematics. Additionally, 30% of our tested population did not demonstrate academic success in Reading, Mathematics, Social Studies and Science on the MEAP test.

The key initiatives at Hope Academy to improve student achievement at Hope Academy are: professional learning for teachers, utilizing data for all aspects for teaching for learning, ensuring that students are taught at the levels which are appropriate for them, increase student's and parent's involvement. Improve student attendance and offer innovative programming for students. We will provide additional assessment opportunities, known as benchmark testing. Through benchmark testing this will provide data frequently to help students

before they fail. These measures will help close the persistent gaps in achievement.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Process for assigning pupils to the school.

Hope Academy parents complete an application and provide enrollment information. This includes last school report card, immunization data, birth certificate and social security information.

2. The status of the 3-5 year School Improvement Plan.

The School Improvement Plan has been completed with all component parts and updated accordingly. Due to Hope Academy's Priority Status, the Redesign Plan contained required components from the School Improvement Plan.

Parents and Community members can access the school's curriculum via the Parent Resource Room at the school. A committee met comprised of a parent rep, teachers, paraprofessionals and administrators to review/update the curriculum. Annual meetings are held with all parents to address their requests for curricula materials, Title I information and additional programming. Each parent receives pertinent information about the curriculum in their child's syllabus.

There are no variances from the state's model.




